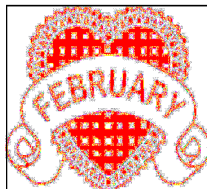

What Is Candlemas?

The Feast of the Presentation of Our Lord in the Temple (2 Feb) is also called the Feast of the Purification of the Virgin (see Luke 2:22) because it celebrates Our Lord's first coming to the Temple at Jerusalem. On this day we use Scripture readings about God's presence in the Temple or Jerusalem, such as "And it shall come to pass at that time, that I will search Jerusalem with candles...". (Zephaniah 1:12) From this reading, the feast takes its popular name of Candlemas, and on it candles are lighted and carried in procession. On the following day, 3 February, in some parishes, after the worship service, those who wish may come forward and have their throats blessed by being touched (externally) with a candle from the day before, and a prayer for protection against respiratory ailments and other throat problems.
