Fourth Sunday of Easter

1st Reading: Acts 13:14, 43-52 Paul and Barnabas preach in Antioch in Pisidia, converting pagans. The local Jews try to undermine them, but Paul challenges them and gives a speech outlining his policy of preaching to the pagans. Paul and Barnabas are ejected from the town.

2nd Reading: Apocalypse 7:9, 14-17 John's vision of the huge number of those who have received salvation. They include people from every nation, tribe and language. One of the elders speaks of the comforts and protection these people have.

Gospel: John 10:27-30 Jesus tells his listeners that the sheep who follow him listen to his voice and that they will never be lost. He states that he and the Father are one.

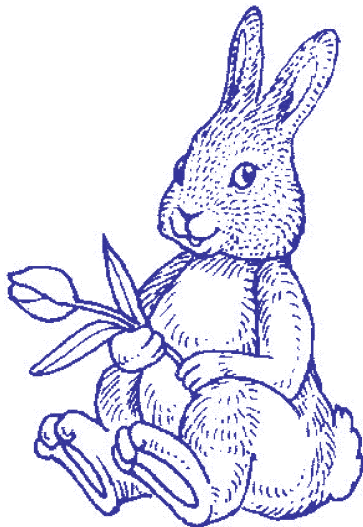
