The Three 'Rs' of Prayer
 Sometimes it's very hard to pray -we don't know what to say, or we don't know how to pray. And yet, if we admit these fears about prayer, it makes us feel spiritually immature. That's ok. Even those closest to Jesus during His life, were confused about prayer. In Luke 11, though, the disciples ask Jesus directly, "Teach us how to pray; what to say; what to do." In teaching The Lord's Prayer, Jesus gives us a simple and powerful format for the "three Rs" of prayer: prayer as a Ritual (and therefore something we can safely return to) recited by rote, yet always there to comfort; prayer as a Reminder of God's care for us and love toward us; and, prayer as a Rejuvenator that gets us going again through the power of God's spirit.



Jesus' Lessons In Prayer
 When asked how Jesus taught us to pray, we all quickly recite the Lord's prayer, indeed a perfect example for us to follow. But do we remember His other teachings on prayer? Take a moment today to look up these Bible references and learn what Jesus said about pray. Then put it into action in your own prayer life.

- Pray in these words: Lk 11:11f
- Pray in secret: Mt 6:6
- Ask and you shall receive: Mt 7:7
- Pray in readiness for end times: Lk 21:36
- Pray for your persecutors: Lk 6:28
- Persist in prayer: Lk 11:5-13
- Unite with other Christians: Mt 18:19-20



“Ask and you shall receive. Seek and you shall find. Knock and it will be opened to you.” Try it! Then listen, look and enter. Perhaps priesthood or consecrated life awaits you. If God is calling you, call Rev.
